# From the Principal

Dear Grass Valley community,

This year it posed new meaning, one that created an immediate impact on our daily lives and routines with changes here at home and around the globe such as self-isolation, quarantine, social distancing and remote education. During challenging times, negativity can surface and take over our emotional well-being. I choose to lean into the positive. It's comforting to know that



amid the uncertainty, there are still moments of strength and hope that showcase the resilience, or grit, that people share in times like these and help us get through this together. The Grass Valley school community is that example. Our pivot to remote learning was not the most graceful, but demonstrated continuous improvement. This trimester has been like no other in our students' history. Please know that **spring grades** will reflect the period during school closure due to COVID-19, and will follow the grading guidance given by the state Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction. During this period of remote learning, each grade-level team at every elementary school identified essential standards for instruction beginning May 4. Grading and feedback for our K-5 students will be for only those essential standards that each grade-level team identified. This means that there will be many areas left blank on report cards. There is no doubt that this is a new and challenging situation for an assessment process. We thank you for your patience and understanding.

We would like to give a special thank you to the **Grass Valley fifth-grade class of 2020**. While the ending may look different than we expected, it has not changed the positive and lasting impact that you have made on us. We thank you for your leadership, curiosity, motivation and challenges each day. Remember to always try your personal best, take responsibility for your learning, be accountable for your decisions and take the lead in spreading joy, even (and especially) during difficult times, and you will be successful.

As we work on planning for the fall, we have a few changes to announce. Jennie Sanchez will be moving from second grade to kindergarten, while Alia Woolfe will slide into an interventionist position that will support grades K-3. Alysha Mueller will be moving from first grade to third grade. We are excited to announce that we have been able to hire Ahna Jura and Shannon Stewart, who will be teaching third grade and fifth grade, respectively. Additionally, next year all third-grade classrooms will be stand-alone classrooms. Mrs. Stewart's fifth-grade class will be a stand-alone model that supports the normal fifth-grade rotation.

We would also like to thank Christina Pachinger for supporting our community this year. We wish her the best as she transitions back to Skyridge Middle School. We also wish the best to Jennifer Pugmire as she moves in her role as Braillist to Skyridge.

As you already know if you watch our video messages, Mrs. Hutton is transitioning to a new role as principal at Helen Baller Elementary. We want to thank her for her outstanding leadership and contributions to the Grass Valley school community. We are all very proud of her and wish her the very best! We will announce the next associate principal when the position is filled.

In closure I would like to take a moment to reflect on the challenges that we are facing as a nation. Race and equity continue to be obstacles that we hear about and see examples of on television and even in our own community. Everyone has the responsibility to treat others with respect and dignity.
